ANIMAL INFORMATION FORM MUST BE INCLUDED WITH FAIR ENTRY, EXHIBITOR AND CAR PASS APPLICATIONS MUST BE MAILED TO SAME ADDRESS BY JUNE 15. Camper applications must be to Camper Committee by June 15 (see application for details.)

Pennsylvania Cattle:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2013 is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). 5 of 18 PA Dept. of Agriculture
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) statement for the animals being exhibited must be included on the fair registration form.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
 - A USDA-issued metal eartag; or
 - A breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible and the animal is accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate; or
 - A breed registration eartag if the animal is accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate; or
 - An ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement*). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

Section 4: Out of State Cattle:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 60 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required. If an animal comes from a state in which Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) has been identified, or a bordering state, the CVI shall include a statement verifying that "all animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from Vesicular Stomatitis. During the past 90 days, these animals have neither been exposed to VS nor located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI).
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) statement for the animals being exhibited must be included on the fair registration form.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
 - A USDA-issued metal eartag; or
 - A breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible and the animal is accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate; or
 - A breed registration eartag if the animal is accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate; or
 - An ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID). 6 of 18 PA Dept. of Agriculture

5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement*). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

6. Testing: Brucellosis Requirements:

- No test is required for exhibition animals which originate from a Brucellosis-free state or are members of a Certified Brucellosis-free Herd.
- Test eligible animals (unvaccinated animals over 8 months (269 days of age) and all animals over 14 months (449 days of age)) originating from Brucellosis Class A, B and C states shall be Brucellosis test negative within 60 days of the opening date of the show. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative laboratory test report (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable).
- An approved laboratory in the state of origin or Canada shall conduct an official blood test for brucellosis, and the imported test-eligible animals shall be negative on an officially approved brucellosis test.

7. Testing: Tuberculosis Requirements:

- No test is required for animals originating from "Accredited Free" states or zones.
- All animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited Advanced" must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).
- All animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited" must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals to be imported (all ages) are test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

General Rules

1. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be disqualified.
2. Exhibitors must have all animals listed for competition on the grounds not later than 12:00 Noon, Sunday. All such animals shall remain on the premises until Saturday at 10 p.m. unless released by Superintendent. Animals sold at Livestock Sale on Thursday will be released at 7:00 AM on Saturday.
3. Entry fee is \$5.00 per head. (non-refundable.) Checks payable to "Jefferson County Fair"
4. Animals entered in Department 10.3 may not be entered in Department 3.
5. Entries accepted at discretion of the Department. Please state any special needs and reasons on the exhibitor entry form.
6. The exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.
7. All entry forms must be in the hands of the Livestock Committee Chair on or before June 15. The entry fee of \$5.00 per head must accompany the entry form.
8. An individual animal may be shown as a market exhibit or a breeding exhibit, but the same individual animal may not be exhibited in both market and breeding classes.
9. All exhibitors must furnish their own bedding and feed. Fresh bedding and cleaned animals must be stalled by noon each day.
10. All exhibitors must wear show clothing.
11. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
12. Any exhibitor/and/or parent interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which exhibitor would otherwise be entitled.
13. All animals must remain until 10:00 PM on Saturday, July 20. (Market animals sold on Thursday, July 18 may leave at 7:00 AM on Saturday, July 20) A poster and photo of market animals is to be left over the pens.

Steers will be divided as equitably as possible into weight classes. Beef Steers shall be free of infections and transmissible diseases.

SECTION 3B - HOME-BRED MARKET CLASS, GENERAL RULES

Home-bred classes for Market Beef will be recognized by the Jefferson County 4-H and Vocational Livestock Program for those whose project animals were born and raised on their family farm. The female, of said breed, must be present, and must have been bred on the farm of the exhibitor. The parents or the exhibitor of the animal must own the female at the time the animal was bred. Exhibitor must have information about parents of the project animal at the time the project animal is tagged. Animals that are entered in the Market Show, and are Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion, will not be eligible to enter in the Home-bred Show. Home-bred classes must have at least two (2) animals in the class, or it will be combined into the next weight class. Home-bred classes will have the same weight requirements as the 4-H and Vocational Market Steers.

SECTION 3B.1 COUNTY BRED

Guidelines

1. All animals must be bred and born in Jefferson County. Appropriate verification paperwork must be completed by the breeder and the exhibitor.
2. Completed paperwork must be turned in to the species' leader on the day of tagging for the species.
3. Weight classes will be as listed for these county bred entries.
4. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals from the Purebred, Market, Carcass, and Homebred Classes will not be eligible to compete in the County Bred Class.
5. The County Bred Classes will show after the classes listed in item # 4.
6. County Bred Classes will NOT be broken down by breed.

**4-H/FFA MARKET STEERS
JEFFERSON COUNTY
RATE OF GAIN WEIGHT REPORT**

This class is designed to reward exhibitors who have properly managed and fed their animals, even though they may not place high in the show ring. Entry is optional. A member may enter up to 4 animals at the start of the competition; however, only 1 of these animals entered will be weighed in for the 1 final entry per member. Animals must be first weighed at the date assigned by the chairperson; and all animals must be weighed on the same scales. The final weight will be the weight at check-in time for the market animals for the showing at the Jefferson County Fair. The average daily gain will be calculated as follows:

Final Weight – Initial Weight/Days from Initial to Final Weigh-In

CLASS 2680 - PREMIUMS:
2.00-2.25 lbs/day = \$10.00 2.26-2.50 lbs/day = \$20.00 2.51 lbs/day and over = \$30.00
