- 3. The meat pen must contain 3 rabbits of the same breed and variety (color)
- 4. Rabbits must be 70 days (10 weeks) or younger at time of sale
- 5. Weigh must be a minimum of 3 ½ lbs. to a maximum of 5 ½ lbs. for each rabbit pen maximum of 16.5 lbs.
- 6. The meat pen must have been born and raised at the residence of the exhibitor.
- 7. Member must notify their 4-H Educator, 4-H club leader or FFA advisor of their intent to enter a meat pen before the doe is bred.
- 8. Member must notify their 4-H educator, 4-H club leader or FFA advisor within three days of the doe's kindling
- 9. The compliance statement must be brought with the rabbits to weigh-in.
- 10. No breeding of rabbits during fair week.
- 11. Entry fee is \$7.00 per cage

- 4 Where one member wins more than one champion showman award, they may select which species they want to show. The second place showman of the other species is then eligible to compete.
- 5 Contestants will show 10 minutes in each class or longer if the judges deem it necessary.
- 6 Members will be scored in the following area in each species:
 - A Personal appearance
 - B Knowledge of the species of which you were chosen champion by answering a question taken from the project material.
 - C Showmanship ability

- 7 Show order will be: Horse, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Beef, Dairy
- 8 The Premier Showman Award will be presented to the overall winner in Senior and Intermediate divisions.
