HEALTH RULES FOR BEEF CATTLE

The Jefferson County Fair Authority adopts all Animal Health Requirements as outlined by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (PDA) and makes all Animal Health Recommendations of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture **REQUIREMENTS** to exhibit at the Jefferson County Fair. The Jefferson County Fair Authority reserves the right to make changes based upon disease emergencies and information from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. All exhibitors should familiarize themselves with the documents which can be found on the fair website www.jeffcofair.com or the PDA website www.agriculture.pa.gov

Complete Health rules are posted on the Jefferson County Fair website at www.jeffcofair.com It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to review the rules and provide the required information (this includes required identification, CVI, vaccinations, blood tests, etc.) Market Animals that are 4-H/FFA animals for the sale are NOT required to have rabies vaccination.

General Rules:

- 1) Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be disqualified.
- 2) Exhibitors must have all open animals listed for competition on the grounds not later than 12:00 Noon, Monday. All such animals shall remain on the premises until Sunday 12:10 a.m. unless released by Superintendent.
- 3) 4-H/Vocational Exhibitors must have all animals listed for competition on the grounds not later than 12:00 Noon, Saturday.
RELEASE TIME WILL BE 12:10 AM on Sunday, July 21, 2024
- 4) Entry fee is \$7.00 per head. Non-refundable. Checks made out to Jefferson County Fair.
- 5) All entry forms and fees must be to the Jefferson County Fair on or before June 15.
- 6) The exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.
- 7) All exhibitors must furnish their own bedding and feed. Fresh bedding and cleaned animals must be stalled by noon each day.
- 8) All exhibitors must wear show clothing. **SHOWS FOR ANIMALS IN DEPARTMENT 3 WILL BE TUESDAY EVENING**
- 9) An individual animal may be shown as a market or a breeding exhibit, but the same individual animal may not be exhibited in both market and breeding classes. An individual animal may be shown as an open exhibit or a 4-H exhibit, but the same individual animal may not be exhibited in both 4-H and open classes.
- 10) Animals owned in partnership (each partner being named on the registration certificate) may be entered in any class under one owner's name or under the partnership name, but must be shown under the same ownership throughout the show. Whoever enters and pays the entry fee is considered the exhibitor of that said animal.
- 11) 4-H/vocational animals may NOT be owned in partnership.
- 12) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect. No person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 13) Any exhibitor and/or parent interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any and all premiums to which the exhibitor would otherwise be entitled.

All exhibitors are responsible for knowing the time their shows will begin and being ready to enter the ring/show area prior to the start time. Those that are late may be disqualified at the discretion of the Judge and/or Superintendent.

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated within 30 days of fair, 2024 for Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Camelids, Rabbits, and Swine.
- Rabies vaccination certificate - A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older. Market animals exempt. See special rules for foals.
- Poultry Blood Certificate as to Testings completed and results
- Poultry must have a CVI or an Owner-endorsed Poultry Health Certificate
- Coggins Test Results - All equine animals must test negative for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the Jefferson County Fair.
