- 1 Judging will be done by a panel of judges.
- 2 To be eligible, you must be enrolled in the project in Jefferson County and must have been a champion showman for the Senior Division (must have been 16 years of age on January 1 of current year) or the Intermediate Division (must have been 12 to 15 years of age on January 1 of current year) in the 4-H and FFA Junior shows in: beef, dairy, horse, sheep, goat, or swine. If the first place individual decides not to participate, the second place individual will become eligible.
- 3 All champion showmen show as one class for each species.
- 4 Where one member wins more than one champion showman award, they may select which species they want to show. The second place showman of the other species is then eligible to compete.
- 5 Contestants will show 10 minutes in each class or longer if the judges deem it necessary.
- 6 Members will be scored in the following area in each species:

- A Personal appearance
- B Knowledge of the species of which you were chosen champion by answering a question taken from the project material.
- C Showmanship ability
- D Courtesy, attitude, and sportsmanship
- 7 Show order will be: Horse, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Beef, Dairy
- 8 The Premier Showman Award will be presented to the overall winner in Senior and Intermediate divisions.
- 9 In case of dispute or ties, the judge's decision will be final.
- 10 Showman cannot win more than two (2) years in specific class.
- 11 Showman will compete as of their age on January 1.
- 12 The Showmanship Committee will select the animals to be shown.
- 13 Participants will draw to determine the animal they will show.
