The Jefferson County Fair Authority adopts all Animal Health Requirements as outlined by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (PDA) and makes all Animal Health Recommendations of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture **REQUIREMENTS** to exhibit at the Jefferson County Fair. The Jefferson County Fair Authority reserves the right to make changes based upon disease emergencies and information from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. All exhibitors should familiarize themselves with the documents which can be found on the fair website www.jeffcofair.com or the PDA website www.agriculture.pa.gov

Complete Health rules are posted on the Jefferson County Fair website at www.jeffcofair.com. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to review the rules and provide the required information (this includes required identification, Certificate of Veterinary Inspection CVI, vaccinations such as Rabies, blood tests - Coggins, etc.)

The Jefferson County Fair will accept the Coggins report that has a picture or drawing of the horse as Permanent Identification and a Veterinarian signed current VCPR may be utilized for Horses only in place of the 30-day CVI.

THERE ARE EXTENSIVE REQUIREMENTS FOR OUT OF STATE HORSES – SEE COMPLETE RULES AS STATED ABOVE.

PAYMENT OF FEES

All checks should be made payable to “Jefferson County Fair”.

The entry fee will be \$7.00 per animal unit (non-refundable). An animal unit is one horse and one rider. **AN INDIVIDUAL SHARING AN ANIMAL MUST SUBMIT A SEPARATE ENTRY FORM INDICATING THE CLASSES THEY WILL SHOW IN AND THE ENTRY FEE OF \$7.00 PER ANIMAL. Animal may not be shown in same class by multiple exhibitors.**

A shared animal is considered as two or more separate entries – each exhibitor sharing an animal must complete an entry form with classes listed and entry fee payable to the Jefferson County Fair.

Example: 1 horse and 3 people sharing the horse means each person completes an entry form and submits \$7 each for \$21 total fee.

Animal’s NAME must be listed on the entry form.

A waiting list exists of exhibitors wishing to bring animals to the fair. If for any reason an exhibitor’s animal is unable to attend the fair, the exhibitor is required to contact the Horse Department immediately so that the next one on the waiting list may be contacted to come. Any

infraction of this rule will result in suspension of participation at future events and will forfeit premium money.

The Summary form must be included to indicate the payments you are making and you may combine them into 1 check. Summary form must be signed.

The members of the Camper Committee will assign camper spaces for the Horse Department.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR HORSE EVENTS AT THE JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR

HELMET RULE: It is mandatory for ALL exhibitors under 18 years of age while riding to wear properly fastened protective headgear and boots which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) / SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag.

Footwear - solid toed shoes (boots preferred) is required while handling (THIS INCLUDES THE WASH RACK AREA), riding or driving anywhere on the event grounds and in all classes.

RIDER RULE: A rider may NOT be fastened or attached in any manner to the horse or tack in any class. "Magic Seats" and rubber bands securing feet in stirrups are NOT allowed. In any class, the judge or show committee may require the removal or alteration of any equipment which is unsafe or inhumane in his/her opinion.

NO BAREBACK RIDING: No bareback riding will be permitted on the fairgrounds during the week of the Jefferson County Fair. (Exception is if a bareback class is held during any of the shows. But do not mount horse/pony until ready to enter the ring.)

NO RIDING DOUBLE

CLOTHING: All riders must wear proper riding clothes and footwear while riding.

JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR GENERAL RULES FOR HORSES

No horse showing evidence of contagious, infectious, or parasitic diseases will be admitted to the fair.

Exhibitors are advised to consult their veterinarians regarding proper conditioning and vaccination of their animals at least thirty days prior to the event.

- 1. No horse may be unloaded until all paperwork has been checked.**
 2. No horse or team of horses shall be entitled to a premium **unless healthy and able to compete.**
 3. Horses entered as matched pairs must be owned by one person or firm.
 4. Animals or combinations of animals owned by one exhibitor may be entered in the classes listed.
 - 5. All animals must be entered in a minimum of one class and be shown.**
 6. In no case is it permissible to show more than one breed in the same class or division to be judged against each other for premiums, except for supreme champion classes.
 7. The Fair reserves the right to refuse any or all entries.
 8. Box stalls for mares with foals will take priority. Other box stalls will be assigned at the discretion of the Horse Committee. Tie stalls for single horses.
 9. All entry forms and fees must be to the Jefferson County Fair on or before June 15.
- Entry forms must have all known classes listed that the exhibitor plans to participate in. Animal's NAME must be listed on the entry form.**

10. Entries must be on the grounds and placed in the stalls by Sunday of Fair Week at 4:00 PM.
11. Release time shall be the following Sunday 12:10 am. All horses must remain in stalls until then, except for animals entered in 4-H Junior Horse Show at Centre Hall if the dates are the same as Fair Week.
12. The age of the participant will be as of Jan 1 of current year.
13. All exhibitors shall furnish their own feed and bedding.
14. Entries accepted at discretion of the Horse Committee.
15. No sleeping in barns.
16. No out-of-state animals will be stabled without proper CVI, approved Shipping Fever, and Registration Certificates.
17. All registered equine must prove registration to show in registered classes. Please include a copy of registration with the entry form.
18. If an equine is double registered, it may only be entered in one breed class.
19. Class additions or changes on the day of the show will be at the discretion of the Horse Committee.

All exhibitors are responsible for knowing the time their shows will begin and being ready to enter the ring/show area prior to the start time. Those that are late may be disqualified at the discretion of the Judge and/or Superintendent.

20. Please state any special needs and reasons on the exhibitor entry form. This would include requests to be stalled with specific exhibitors.
21. Drafts are permitted to use the ring for one-half hour following show.
22. Lights in barns and arena are to be turned off by midnight.
23. Stall decoration requirements:
 - Remember your creativity is key
 - Must have name of horse, age of horse, breed, owned by, and shown by
 - Emergency contact and where staying must be listed
 - All decorations, staples, nails, screws, etc. must be removed from the stall at the end of the fair.** Horse Committee will be checking that this has been done prior to release of premium money.
24. **Tack stalls may be available if there are open stalls, must obtain permission from the Horse Committee and cleaned at the end of the fair. It is recommended that a covering (a simple shower curtain) or decorations be placed on the front screen of the stall.**
25. Class entry numbers are NOT Show Order. Show order will be announced at the Exhibitor Meeting on Sunday at beginning of Fair.
26. Exhibitors are requested to sign-up to assist with a minimum of one show. Sign-up forms available at Exhibitor Meeting on July 13 at 8:00 pm.
27. Exhibitor Meeting – Sunday, July 13, 2025 at 8:00 pm. All exhibitors must attend – if unable to attend, it is the exhibitor’s responsibility to contact Department Superintendent.
28. NEW for 2025 – There will be a refundable “Snap” deposit required from all exhibitors using stalls in Horse Barn 1. Payment (\$5 per snap) must be made when horse is stalled. Refund will be made when “Snap” is returned at end of Fair. Details provided at Sunday meeting.

Unannounced inspections will be made daily.

CLASS 2 - STALL DECORATIONS

Equine exhibitors are encouraged to decorate their stalls. One will be selected as the week-long winner. Must follow established guidelines: must have name of horse, age of horse, breed, owned by, and shown by; an emergency contact name & number must be listed along with location of where they are staying.



- **Novice Riders may only enter Novice Classes. A Novice Rider is a person in their first 2 years of showing. These are walk/trot only classes. May not enter any loping or cantering classes. A Novice rider may have a handler but the judge will take that into consideration when evaluating the rider/horse.**
- **Adult Walk/Trot rider/horse combo may not enter any loping or cantering classes.**
- **Ages of riders is based upon age on January 1 of current year**
- **Adult 19 years and older; Senior 13 years to 18 years, Junior 12 years and under**
- **Class order is NOT necessarily the same as Show Order. Show Order will be posted at the Announcer Stand the evening prior to the show.**
- **The Horse Committee uses the PA 4-H Rule Book, The PDA Guidelines, and other accredited horse standards as references to operate these shows. Final decision on rules will be made by the Horse Committee.**




